

## ADMISSION ELIGIBILITY (B. ID and B. CT)

### Available Seats

#### Seats available for admission process are known as:

- **Government Seats (process done by ACPC)**

- I. All the sanctioned seats of Bachelor of Interior Design and Bachelor of Construction Technology, In the Government Colleges or Institutions of the State;
- II. All the sanctioned seats of Bachelor of Interior Design and Bachelor of Construction Technology, In the aided Colleges or Institutions;
- III. Fifty percent (50%) of the total sanctioned seats of Bachelor of Interior Design and Bachelor of Construction Technology, in the Unaided Colleges or Institutions, and
- IV. All supernumerary seats of the professional courses, in the Government Colleges or Institutions and in the aided and unaided Colleges or Institutions.

- **Management/All India Seats: (process done by Unaided Institute)**

- I. Fifty percent (50%) seats of the total sanctioned seats of the Bachelor of Interior Design and Bachelor of Construction Technology in the unaided Colleges or Institutions, including fifteen (15%) percent NRI seats;
- II. The intimation received, in respect of sanction of seats, by the Admission Committee three days prior to the counseling program, shall be considered as available seats.

Provided further that the registration and preparation of merit list of the Management Seats shall be managed, finalized and declared by the concerned college or institution.

### Qualifying Examination Eligibility (for the year 2021-2022)

- **Bachelor of Interior Design**

A candidate shall have passed HSC (10+2) Examination with Physics and Mathematics as compulsory subjects and Chemistry / Biotechnology / Biology / Computer as an optional subject with 50% marks (45% for SC/ST/SEBC/EWS) in aggregate and also at least 50% marks (45% for SC/ST/SEBC/EWS) in aggregate of the HSC (10+2) examination and have obtained valid score in the NATA as prescribed by Council.

OR

Passed 10+3 Diploma examination with Mathematics as compulsory subject having obtained at least 50% marks (45% for SC/ST/SEBC/EWS) in the aggregate and have obtained valid score in the NATA as prescribed by Council.

- **Bachelor of Construction Technology**

A candidate shall have passed HSC (10+2) Examination with minimum 45% marks (40% for SC/ST/SEBC/EWS) of theory (or theory and practical) marks of Physics & Mathematics as compulsory subjects with (Chemistry or Biology or Computer or Technical Vocational subject) from a single board and have appeared in the JEE (Main) of corresponding year.

## Reservation for Admission

**[A] For the purpose of admission in Government Seats, the seats shall be reserved under the following categories and in following proportion, namely: -**
